Thistle Fleet 176 Report Tim Theisen

Thistle Fleet, Hot Competition and a Great District Regatta!

After four races in Thistle fleet 176 schedule for 2008, familiar names are again at the top of the results chart, with Dan Reasoner and Craig Smith finishing 1st and 2nd respectively in all events, and the Bensons and Paul Prozillo neck-and-neck for 3rd. May 31 saw six boats and only one race due to heavy rain and thunderstorms. June 7 had nine boats at the start.

The real fun is in the middle of the fleet where we are seeing very close racing this season with every mark rounding being contested by multiple boats and finishing order left up in the air until well into the final leg, sometimes with only a few seconds separation at the line. Here's warning to the RC that they need to be on their toes when the Thistles are racing.

The big news this year is Fleet 176 hosted a very exciting Thistle NJ District Championship at Lake Nockamixon June 14-15 that saw a total of six races over the two days. A total of 19 boats participated, including a record 12 skippers from Fleet 176. Reasoner (4th) and Smith (5th) delivered the best performances for the Nockamixon Thistle Fleet. Day 1 saw light winds and long spinnaker runs that tended to favor boats with underweight crews. This changed on Day 2 to a constant wind of 8-12 over four laps of a short course that stressed good crew and helm work at the marks. The Fleet wishes to express their gratitude to all NSC members who volunteered time to make this event a success.

The following racing report was **submitted by Greg Morrison** and gives us a great look at the highly competitive Flying Scot Fleet: Scot Fleet racing in 2008 has exemplified everything we look for in a one-design class: close racing, many different skippers in contention for top finishes, and strong competition tempered by good sportsmanship. The number of different winners we have had so far this year is indicative of the quality of the racing. Out of 4 Saturday races so far we have had 3 different skippers win (Cohen, Morrison, Scheetz). With 5 Sunday races in the books we have had 4 different winners (Rittenburg,Tourtellot, Mandell, Noone). We have had 6

Regatta races and 5 different skippers have won (Scheetz, Noone, Morrison, Rittenburg, Mandell). Overall 7 different skippers have crossed the line first, and many others have been hot on their transoms for good finishes. Competition for the yearly series awards is already tight and looks to remain so right up through the last race. Participation in general has been strong with 9 skippers competing in at least one race in our Saturday and Sunday series, and 10 skippers competing thus far in our Regatta series. **Greg**

The cruising fleet will emphasize the use of VHF radios at all cruising fleet events this season. VHF radios are not required by law for the size of vessels on Lake Nockamixon, but use of VHF radios are recommended so you can communicate with other vessels, obtain weather information, get help in an emergency, know if someone needs assistance, or just for fun. For years the NSC racing fleet has used channel 68 to communicate. Mike Brown, Cruising Fleet Captain has announced that the cruising fleet

If you are trying to remember the channel to use just think one-up from the channel the racers use. Being able to talk to each other on our vessels should make it more fun and safer for everyone so if you do not already have a VHF please get one, and if you do have a VHF radio please use it. Please also note that there is a presentation available on the cruising page of the NSC website that can be downloaded for free which describes proper use of VHF radios on Lake Nockamixon.

Cruising Fleet Update

The state of the cruising fleet has never been better. Participation in Cruising Fleet events has increased dramatically due to the Cruising Fleet calendar offering our members overwhelming value in terms of social interaction with other sailors, opportunities to learn in numerous skills seminars, expansion of the Catalina 22 fleet, and numerous fun events that allow our members to combine social interaction with building skill and confidence on the water. At the time of this writing, the most popular events thus far have been the Bird Watching Cruise; Meet Your Neighbor Day, where we visited each other's sailboats; Introduction to Racing for cruisers; Summer Sailstice/Picture Day, where our members celebrated the first day of the summer by getting pictures taken of their sailboats on the water; skills training on VHF radio; and the Rules of the Road training seminar, where a dozen members actually showed up in the rain to learn about the Rules.

For the first time, the cruising fleet has emphasized use of VHF radios at all events and this has increase enjoyment and safety for all. We have also improved the value of members visiting the cruising fleet page of the NSC website by posting a series of documents on the cruising fleet page for free download that improve knowledge of seamanship on Lake Nockamixon for our members.
