Vince Wright and Warren Ibaugh were recognized at the Fall Banquet for their service to the club.

In nominating Vince Wright for Honorary Membership in NSC, past Commodore, Mike Noone, said that it was a pleasure, and an honor, for him to be able to nominate Vince to become an Honorary Member of the Club. Vince Wright was a major contributor to the long-term success of the Club from the 70's to the late 90's and served two terms as NSC Commodore in 1994 and 1995. Vince raced a Buccaneer with his wife Linda as Crew, and they received many racing awards for their success on the racecourse. Vince was influential in the success of the Buccaneer Fleet in the 70's and 80's when it was the one of the largest Fleets in the Club, and led the Fleet as Champion and Regatta winner. Vince was also Fleet Captain of the Handicap Fleet in the 90's.

Thistle Fleet 176 Report Craig Smith

Congratulations Dan Reasoner – 2008 Thistle Fleet Champion!



The Nockamixon Thistle Fleet crowned Dan Reasoner the 2008 Fleet Champion at the NSC Awards banquet on November 8th. Craig Smith finished in second place for the series, followed by Paul Prozzillo in third, Tim Theisen in fourth, and Warren Rosen in fifth. Also at the banquet, Tim Theisen, was awarded the "Fleet Recognition Trophy" for "perfect attendance" by racing in all 24 fleet races in 2008! Way to go Tim!! We had a total of 7 skippers who qualified for the fleet championship trophy. Congratulations to all.

The Nockamixon Thistle Fleet held 9 fleet race days this year. We averaged 7.1 boats on the line each day, and the competition was fierce with 6 different skippers having at least one first place finish. Fleet 176 also hosted the 2009 New Jersey District Championship. There were 19 competitors including one former Thistle

National Champion. Our fleet had a record of 12 boats competing in the event.

Next year promises to be another great one for the Thistle Fleet. Paul Prozzillo will be leading us, as he was elected the 2009 Fleet Captain at the "Annual Meeting" held in November. Tim Theisen was elected Fleet Secretary. We look forward to the direction the new fleet officers will be taking us. Let's be sure to give them our support. We should have at least one new fleet member next year, Fritz Goetz, who will be sailing with his son, Adam, who sailed with us several times this year. Also, Paul's boat (#3453) is now for sale since he has recently purchased #3911. Hopefully, we he can find a buyer who will join us for fleet racing on Lake Nockamixon.

Several Fleet Members plan to take the trip to St. Petersburg, Florida, in March for the Thistle Midwinters East Regatta. A component of that event is the "Coach TCA" program, which is one of the best week long intensive training programs in the country. If you are on the fence about going, let Craig Smith know. He can help you make arrangements to get there. If you can't attend as a skipper, please consider coming as crew.

Speaking of Craig Smith, he will be serving as Thistle Class President in 2009. This is the second time a Nockamixon Thistle fleet member will have served as Thistle Class President. Charlie Krafft held that position in 1993, while he was a member of Fleet 176. Also, fleet member (and Fleet Champion) Dan Reasoner, will continue to serve as Commodore of the Nockamixon Sail Club in 2009. He has been doing a great job in this position, and should continue to do so next year. Let's be sure to support him in that position.

Flying Scot Fleet 163 Report Mike Noone



2008 Season Summary and Awards at the NSC Banquet: Flying Scot Fleet # 163 celebrated another great season of highly competitive racing, and great social camaraderie, with Fleet Awards presented at the 2008 NSC Awards Banquet. The Flying Scot Fleet is the largest one-design Fleet in the Club and was the largest at the Banquet with 8 Scot Skippers and 6 Scot crew in attendance. Our efficient Scorekeeper, and Fleet Social Director, Greg Morrison, gave a summary of the "record" season for Flying Scot sailing at the Lake. In 2008, we held 44 Fleet races; 24 Scot Skippers participated in Fleet racing events; 11 different skippers won races; a different Skipper won each of the Fleet Racing Series; 8 Skippers "qualified" for the Fleet Championship; and 8 boats participated in the Challenge of the Lakes. With an average attendance of 7 boats at Fleet events, there were over 300 individual Flying Scot racing experiences at the Lake in 2008!!!

In 2008, the Flying Scot Fleet broke, and set a new "record" for the number of boats at the FSSA National Championships -- 7 (yes SEVEN) Fleet boats attended and they comprised fully 10% of the entire attendance at the event, and 1/3 of the Challenger Fleet!! Fleet # 163 was also represented at the FSSA Midwinter's Championships -- where a Fleet boat won a race for the first time ever in a major FSSA event -- at the Wife-Husband Championships, at the Sandy Douglass Memorial Championships, and the ACC's. In 2008 we also welcomed 4 new Racing Members and 3 more Cruising Members to our Fleet which ended the year with 48 members.

Greg Morrison presented the following Racing Awards for a season that was the most competitive, and tightly contested, in the history of the Fleet:

- -- To Matt Cohen, winner of the Saturday Series sailing in the oldest (and fastest on Saturdays) boat in the Fleet # 520.
- -- To Craig Tourtellott, winner of the Sunday Series in # 4444, "Four Fours."
- -- To Mike and Brenda Noone, winners of the Regatta Series in # 5468, "Hi-Noone."
- -- To Phil Scheetz, 2nd Place in the Saturday Series and 3rd in the Regatta Series.

Greg presented the Fleet # 163 Championship Trophy to Mike and Brenda Noone for the best score from 20 Fleet races in the 2008 season.

Mike Noone then presented Greg Morrison with a trophy for 2nd Place in the Sunday Series, 2nd Place in the Saturday Series, and 3rd Place in the Regatta Series. Mike commented that Greg had sailed in more fleet races, 35 in all, than any other Fleet sailor. Sailing generally with wife Judy, occasionally with brother Jim, and several times "solo," Greg was always in a winning mode and came within 4 points of winning the Fleet Championship award!!!

Mike also presented our Fleet Measurer, Phil Scheetz, with a Loos Gauge so that he can check the correct tension of all of the Fleet boats as he performs his measurement duties in 2009!!!

Mike then presented some other Fleet Awards for the 2008 season:

- -- To Glenn and Dorothy Wesley, Fleet Champion Qualifiers in # 3834 "DJ."
- -- To Rob and Lois Wilkinson, Great Fleet Competitors in # 4516.
