





Portsmouth Fleet *Racing Signal Flags*

Racing Signals and Sounds

The races held by the Nockamixon Sail Club use visual racing signals/ flags and sounds/ horn to help the skipper understand what the Race Committee (RC) for the day is doing before, during and after a race.

LEGEND: An arrow pointing up or down means that a visual signal is displayed or removed. When a visual signal is displayed along with a fleet flag, the signal applies only to that fleet.

All races not started are abandoned



Portsmouth Class starting signal



Individual Recall, boat is over the starting line, early



Shortened course signal, lead boat sails to next mark and then finishes - defines the course

M Signal

Displaying this signal replaces a missing mark



Position of next mark has been changed



Ashore: A notice to competitors has been posted.

Afloat: Come within hail or follow this boat. (sound/ horn required)

Y Signal


Wear personal buoyancy
